President

Meeting called to order by President, Kim O'Quinn at 7:07pm

Kim gave opening words related to the importance of the event and keeping kids safe by staying off the roads after midnight.

It was discussed and that this is 100% parent driven event both financially and from a volunteer standpoint. Much is needed in both areas. We are all encouraged to talk this up with our kids and encourage them to attend and get excited about it.

VP of Event

VP1, Kathleen Stearns, discussed the "Night of" event and that she'd like to make this as fun as possible for all the kids. MANY volunteers are needed that evening (who will be staying up most all night) and you do earn Lobo Bucks. The event will run from midnight to 5am. Organized buses will transport the kids to and from the event.

Membership

VP Membership, Sabrina Alexander & Katie Robinson, spoke about the Lobo Point program and how volunteer hours earn points for your child. If both parents volunteer, your child gets twice the points. Your time is just as needed as the financial contributions.

Treasury

Treasurer, Lynn Honeycutt, gave Treasurer's report

Beginning Sept balance was \$486.21. The ending Sept balance was \$8991.04. However, an additional \$3k was generated at the beginning of October. Detail of balance was discussed. We are almost at goal for Membership. Approximately \$2k is needed which is about 16 memberships at \$120. We'd like to exceed our goal to make up for other events that might be short. Paw Prints are at about the halfway mark at \$1200. Mums just began but as of now, the numbers look low. The BBQ truck event did great and met goal of approximately \$1000. There is \$2500 in Corporate Sponsorship.

Fundraising

D'Anna Eggers encouraged all grades to join a kickball team. We are encouraged to promote events and Pawprints to our underclassmen friends which will help carry on tradition. The Mums are getting good reviews from those that have received them. The deadline is Sunday to order. It is also a good time to begin speaking to your son about their "talent" for Mr. Lobo. Each Chair spoke briefly about their event.

**Mum Chair**, Tracy Stucky, spoke regarding Mum sales. Sales are expected to increase this week. However, the deadline is Sunday. She is looking for a couple of volunteers at lunch tomorrow. A mum display was made available tonight. Parents can also come by at lunch to see the mums in person. The

The **kick ball team**, Hollie Choate & Jill McCall, discussed registration just opened for kickball. Event is Sunday 11/17 12-5pm at the YMCA. Adult co-ed teams are encouraged to play kickball too. Packets were handed out with several parent teams forming. They would like to see 10 adult teams and 10 student teams. It may be best to have at least 14 players on the adult teams. They would like to see groups like soccer, basketball, NHS, etc. form teams. Teams must be co-ed with an even male/female number on the field at all times. They were excited to announce that the Hernandez family will be cooking the BBQ for us and a plate is included for all paid team members. He is donating brisket and the chairpersons received donations from other parents, Walmart, Sprouts, Fuddruckers & NHS to cover the cost of the food. Others are welcome to come watch and enjoy lunch and snacks for purchase. Referees are needed. A volunteer sheet was made available for anyone who can help during lunch.
